# Award-Winning Author and Illustrator Takes Readers on an Existential Journey through a Worm's-Eye View

Did you know earthworms can eat rose thorns without harming themselves? Or that, when not consuming such *haute cuisine*, most of a worm's diet is simply the soil through which they dig endless tunnels?

Behind a façade of playfully ironic language and delightful illustrations, award-winning author Noemi Vola's *The Unfortunate Life of Worms* reveals these facts and more as she reaches for earnest human truths through her collected notes on earthworms.

The book strikes a balance between thought-provoking, curious poetry and extremely approachable nonfiction for nature lovers and satire aficionados alike. Fans of contemporary comics will also appreciate Vola's simple, clever drawings and commentary.

*The Unfortunate Life of Worms* has already garnered a positive critical response in her home country of Italy, where the book received a special mention in the annual Bologna Ragazzi Crossmedia Awards in 2022.

As comic book outlet, *Dimensione Fumetto* puts it, "Vola, in a state of unattainable grace, manages to insert the most surreal situations and the strangest worlds between the pages."

*The Unfortunate Life of Worms* resulted from the author's jarring realization that, upon seeing a worm split in two, she had no idea how the two bodies could continue living independently.

She embarked on a four-year quest to learn more about these underappreciated creatures, gathering esoteric knowledge, launching a four-part worm-themed podcast, and eventually creating the book and the story of a worm who must deal with the crisis

of having been separated from its other half. This story lends an engrossing narrative arc to the latter portion of the book and invites readers to recognize how even the smallest, strangest, and most unknown creatures can be welcomed and celebrated.

While its bright colors and brief text may indicate that the book is geared toward a younger audience, *The Unfortunate Life of Worms* is truly a book for any reader on a journey to find their purpose and a place in the world.
